Transfer Students

ENTERING DURING THE 2022–2023 ACADEMIC YEAR

St. Ambrose offers excellent scholarships and grants, work-study and other financial aid options! Full-time students may be eligible based upon your strong academic performance in college, your talent in fine arts or athletics or your demonstrated financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

ST. AMBROSE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

Phi Theta Kappa Academic Scholarship

Awarded to all Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society members transferring from a community college
Award: \$17,000

OR

Transfer Academic Scholarship

Based on GPA

Award: 3.5–4.0 GPA: \$16,500
3.0–3.49 GPA: \$15,500
2.5–2.99 GPA: \$14,500
2.0–2.49 GPA: \$11,500

Fr. Welch Alumni Scholarship

Parent is a St. Ambrose graduate
Award: \$1,000 per year on campus
\$500 per year off campus

Athletic Scholarship

Performance and ability, marching band scholarships also available
Award: varies

Fine Arts Scholarship

Performance and ability in Art, Music and Theatre.
Audition or portfolio required
Award: varies

Dual Admission Scholarship

Participant in SAU/community college dual admission program
Award: \$1,000 maximum

Minority Scholarship

Ethnically diverse students, FAFSA required.
Additional aid available by application
Award: \$500 per year

FEDERAL AND STATE AID

Federal Pell Grant

Based on financial need. File FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1.
Award: \$6,800 maximum

Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (FESOG)

Based on financial need, priority to Pell Grant recipients.
File FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1.
Award: \$400 maximum

Federal Work Study

Based on financial need. File FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1.
Award: \$1,850

St. Ambrose scholarships awarded for fall and spring semesters only, and are renewable up to 120 credits of undergraduate study, which includes credits transferred to St. Ambrose from prior attendance. For example: transfer in an AA/AS degree, receive scholarship for two additional years at St. Ambrose.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

FEDERAL DIRECT LOANS

Parent PLUS Loan

Criteria: available to parents, not need based
Loan amount: cost of attendance, less other aid received

Subsidized and Unsubsidized Undergraduate

First-year (0–29 credit hours)

Loan amount: Dependent: \$5,500 (\$3,500 maximum subsidized limit); Independent: \$9,500 (\$3,500 maximum subsidized limit)

Sophomore (30–59 credit hours)

Loan amount: Dependent: \$6,500 (\$4,500 maximum subsidized limit); Independent: \$10,500 (\$4,500 maximum subsidized limit)

Junior, Senior (60+ credit hours)

Loan amount: Dependent: \$7,500 (\$5,500 maximum subsidized limit); Independent: \$12,500 (\$5,500 maximum subsidized limit)

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Send in your complete application for admission, including all supporting materials (test scores, official transcripts, etc.). Only full time students who have been admitted and are degree-seeking are eligible to receive financial awards.

As soon as possible after October 1, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available at www.studentaid.gov. SAU code 001889.

St. Ambrose's priority deadline is March 15. Students who submit the FAFSA before this date will have priority in receiving institutional funds and funds with limited sources.
